1783 U.S. claims Native land & establishes territory borders. Michigan was an area of numerous disputes due to its abundant natural resources.

1805 Northern Michigan Territory home to the Ojibwa & Ottawa Tribes

1837 Michigan becomes a state

1840 Logging and railroad advances lead to the establishment of Gustin

1886 Detroit, Bay City & Alpena Railroad established Gustin station

1891-1910 Gustin Post Office Postmaster - Albert J. Wood

1907 Lincoln Herald Newspaper

1909 Huron National Forest Designation

1931 McNitt Act created the Authority of Townships

1945 U.S. Forestry Services combine Huron – Manistee National Forests
